A \$575K Greenwich Village Studio (With Herman Miller Built-Ins) and a Renovated Harlem Two-Bedroom

For under \$1 million, one can find all sorts of housing configurations: park- and subway-adjacent studios, one-bedrooms hidden in carriage houses or former shoe factories, and even the occasional true twobedroom. With price drops rampant across Manhattan and vacancies high citywide, we're combing the market for particularly spacious, nicely renovated, or otherwise worth-a-look apartments at various sixdigit price points. This week: a Greenwich Village studio with Herman Miller built-ins, a Brooklyn Heights apartment with multiple skylights and fireplaces, and more.



A Greenwich Village Studio With Herman Miller Built-Ins for \$575K

101 West 12th Street Apt. 15E — Sitting on the 15th-floor of a 1960s doorman co-op (just below the 14th Street F and L trains), this studio comes with several efficient built-ins. In addition to a white Murphy bed/sofa combo, there are also two Herman miller wall units — one with floating cabinets that serves as a media console, and another with more storage and a workspace — both of which are included in the sale. All of the furniture that currently gives the space a mid-century time-capsule feel, like Bertoia's orange wire chairs and Bird chair plus ottoman, are available for purchase separately. The renovated kitchen has stainless-steel appliances (including a dishwasher), along with more open shelving. The building, which takes up the full west side of the block between West 12th and 13th Streets on Sixth Avenue, is topped by a large, landscaped roof terrace garden with seating and a gazebo.
